Welcoming	The Car park is the first point of Welcome, uneven but functional assured by the Gatley Carrs Conservation Group GCCG, that Stockport City Council, who is responsible for the site, have been approached to carry out remedial works. Although this is in effect a Natural setting, the degree of maintenance allows the entrance to be open, inviting but not clinical.	Ask that GCCG keep SCC informed of the Car Park Situation.
Good and safe access	Access is perfect for this naturalised area. Around the pond, chicken wire, is in place to prevent the duckboards from becoming a skating rink, the steps approaching the side of the Motorway, had been swept, removing all the leaf debris, which would definitely accumulate during the year.	No further comment is necessary.
Signage	There is up-to-date information emblazoned on Sign Boards, throughout the site. These describe the Fauna and flora within the surrounding area and also have pockets for leaflets which can be taken by visitors. The signage to the Site, along the major routes is very useful.	With so many signs, maintenance is a problem, whereby, some are needing a wee bit of elbow grease and soapy water, to make them gleam once again. I am sure as the Volunteers return after the C 19 hiatus; they will look brand spanking new.
